• The QLIP Partnership involvement in the CSN Network has included the promotion of the QLIP project including QLIP current work and achievements and encourages services providers to join the QLIP in its efforts.

Partnerships / Protocols / Community Services - Labour Market Outcomes Strategy: QUIS & Community Employment Services - Loyalist College CES

The QLIP Partner, Community Employment Services – Loyalist College CES, collaborative work with QUIS to affect or transform the labour market outcomes for newcomers has continued to operate during the reporting period of December (2013) through January and February 2014. The strategy which involves having a CES Employment Consultant attend at the QUIS offices on Thursday afternoons for booked appointments or drop-in's to provide advice to newcomers who do not normally attend employment offices, and the strategy is working for newcomers. In this comfortable atmosphere success has flourished in terms of employment prospects for newcomers. Joanne Leith from CES has met with a variety of people with different visa statuses (some visitors, some PRs, etc), and varying language abilities. Outcomes have varied but are promising. A related anecdotal example of client success e.g. discussing interview approaches prior to a client's actual interview – newcomer client got the job. In addition, CES has been able to refer/connect clients with other important employment and related service providers. These meetings have been shown to boost newcomer clients' confidence to move forward. One of the recognized challenges for newcomers is that newcomers often do not have networks. CES can only offer certain assistance depending on visa status, and must curtail/withhold some services, e.g.: work permit holders cannot get employment subsidies. Some of the clients are students so not all are unemployed.

Partnerships / Protocols / Community Services - Labour Market Outcomes Strategy: Quinte United Immigrant Services QUIS - Data Base Development

• On December 15, 2013 QUIS embarked on a new six month undertaking to map out a data base of Quinte Region employers, and a data base of the employable skills available within the QUIS client database of approximately 1400. The research is being conducted by a Research Coordinator who is building a database of employers in the Quinte area, and the skills in demand, and a Research Assistant who is developing a data base of the employable skills available within the QUIS client database.

Partnerships / Protocols / Community Services - Labour Market Outcomes Strategy Destination Canada Presentation February 25, 2014

• QLIP Partner, the Francophone Immigration Support Network of East Ontario organized a very successful Destination Canada (initiative of Citizenship and Immigration Canada) program presentation for employers in the Quinte Region to help employers attract and recruit bilingual foreign professionals in a streamlined and accelerated manner to deal with their labour market shortages. • The QLIP partnership met on February 11, 2013 at the Quinte Sports and Wellness Centre in Belleville at the Fireplace Room provided by the City of Belleville. At this meeting the partners were advised that two Ontario Provincial websites, one dedicated to attracting Francophone's to Ontario municipalities Viens vivre en Ontario and another bilingual site Living in Ontario dedicated attracting people to Ontario municipalities had no reference to the Quinte area. As a result of the QLIP research the oversight is now being looked into by the Province and may relate to the lack of an immigration portal for Quinte Region.
