The Northumberland county individuals shared their program initiative "Improving Prosperity for Immigrant Women in Northumberland County - 15 Women" which is in its initial stages and it is anticipated that through collaboration and new protocols there will be benefits accrued to immigrant women including those in the QLIP catchment area. Discussions centred on sharing information, insights, protocols, best practices and networking for the betterment of newcomers.
- Veronica Hendrick-Lockyer Spokesperson for Glass Tower Offices Corp. also joined the meeting and advised that she is quite keen to learn as much as possible to be able to assist where needed with immigrant women when they first arrive, if they are without family (husbands or parents) to support them or if they have been here awhile and are in need of assistance. In addition, she advised that it would be fantastic to take time to learn more about both Quinte Immigration Services, and the new program (15 women) in Northumberland County working to enhance the economic prosperity of immigrant women in their rural area. Eventually she would like to develop a program with housing for immigrant women and will be taking the first steps of it this year with a team of Loyalist College Students through our Enactus program\* (one of the most prolific volunteer organizations at Loyalist) and will

involve students from India, Germany, Japan and the United States (and perhaps others) in a global effort to improve the lives of immigrant women. \* Enactus: <u>En</u>trepreneurial - having the perspective to see an opportunity and the talent to create value from that opportunity; <u>Action</u> - the willingness to do something and the commitment to see it through even when the outcome is not guaranteed; <u>Us</u> - a group of people who see themselves connected in some important way; individuals that are part of a greater whole. <u>http://enactus.org</u>

- Military Family Resource Centre Trenton Department of National Defence represented by Susan Sweetman Executive Director FMRC met with a few QLIP Partners, QLIP Coordinator, and QLIP Facilitator on July 08 2015 and is a prospect to become a QLIP Partner in relation to newcomers who may be military spouses or dependants.

- **Sports and Belonging** QLIP Partners were provided the results of a new study entitled "Playing together: Canada's first national study on new citizens, sports & belonging" to encourage networking on the subject of "sports and belonging" for newcomers, in order to consider ideas that might move the QLIP "welcoming community" agenda forward.
- The YMCA and QUIS collaborative effort for newcomers to Quinte to encourage newcomer families to participate in YMCA programs was referenced in the communication in order to open the debate within the Quinte community to consider the report recommendations.
- Information on the study that was communicated to QLIP Partners included local references, email content: An impressive new study has been released by the Institute for Canadian Citizenship (ICC) entitled "Playing together: Canada's first national study on new citizens, sports & belonging." "New citizen respondents told us sports are a natural and universal connection point, more welcoming than many other social structures, including the workplace." Sports also help new citizens learn the Canadian social landscape and soft cultural skills, while offering access to informal, but vital, social networks." Trenval is basically the "financial" partner of the Small Business Centre.

- QLIP and QUIS meeting with Highline Mushrooms representatives Karen Rushlow from their Wellington operation and Susan McBride Director of Director of Human Resources who is based in Leamington. They have a facility in Leamington Ontario and Wellington in Prince Edward County. Highline Mushrooms is a family company, now the largest independently owned and operated mushroom growers in Canada. The Wellington Mushroom Farm established in 1990 is in Prince Edward County and within the QLIP catchment area.
- Highline Mushrooms employs 318 workers and staff including a significant number of newcomers to the Quinte area. They provide transportation (bus) to the facility from Belleville. They have been sponsoring and paying for many of their employees to take ESL courses in Belleville at the Loyola School.
- **Highline Mushrooms became a QLIP Partner.** Susan McBride Director of Director of Human Resources requested becoming a QLIP Partner which was agreed to, and was advised that their participation is welcomed.

- QLIP Partnership consultations on the workshop continued in July and as a result a Business Start Up Basics (BSB) Workshop will be provided by the Small Business Centre (QLIP Partner) in partnership with Quinte Immigration Services QUIS and the Loyola School of Adult and Continuing Education (QLIP Partner). The workshop will be held at the QUIS offices on Tuesday August 19, 2014 from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m. The workshop will be helpful to newcomers considered starting their own business or who may be in the early stages of starting up. The workshop information was disseminated and newcomers will be encouraged to attend with the assistance of the Loyola School of Adult and Continuing Education, QUIS and the QLIP Partners. It is anticipated that additional workshop opportunities will be provided in the fall of 2014.
