- Sustaining partnerships at the community level QLIP Partnership Meeting Minutes
- Issued the Minutes of the QLIP Partnership meeting of September 23, 2014 held at the Quinte West Municipal Offices.
- October 2014
- QLIP Partnership Facilitator attended three meetings of the "Bay of Quinte Living Council"
- QLIP Facilitator attended three meetings with the Bay of Quinte Council for the marketing and strategic planning committees in October, ensuring a continued emphasis on the attraction and retention of newcomers for the Quinte Region

- QLIP Facilitator conference call/meetings with Ryerson University representatives for the Magnet Project
- Conference calls were conducted in reference to the Magnet project including follow up with several QLIP partners on specific project proposals. Magnet is recognized as a progressive website based employment "engine" emphasizing skills and education which has potential for newcomers and improving labour market integration http://www.magnet.today

- Strengthen labour market outcomes for newcomers to the Greater Quinte Region
- QLIP Partner Community Employment Services Loyalist College (CES) Employment
 Consultant met with one newcomer for employment counselling at QUIS in October 2014.
- October 01, 2014
 QLIP Project Coordinator and QLIP Facilitator met with Chuck O'Malley on October 01, 2014
 at Loyalist Training and Knowledge Centre to discuss the no-cost on-the-job training and job
 placement program for manufacturing jobs in relation to the possibilities for newcomers.
- QLIP facilitator and Project Coordinator met with Chuck O'Malley, Corporate Account Manager, Loyalist Training & Knowledge Skills Centre LTKSC, at Loyalist College and the Project Lead to discuss the "Elevate Training Program" and how newcomers to the Quinte Region can participate. The program seeks to integrate job-specific skills and literacy and essential skills in the food processing industry. A no-cost on-the-job training program with support services available, and on completion a possible job offer in the food processing industry in the Quinte Region. It may be a program for newcomers and the six week training session has a possible start date of October 20th or 27th. The applicants must be unemployed and able to attend classes.

- QLIP Partner Hastings County Economic Development Manager planning for short videos of newcomers bringing their business to Hastings County
- QLIP partner Andrew Redden Economic Development Manager Hastings County contacted
 the QLIP Project Coordinator to advise that he is planning to do short 1-2 minute videos
 where he interview an immigrant (whether recent or years ago) who has established or
 relocated their business in Hastings County. The idea is to post the video (with their
 permission) on the Hastings County YouTube channel and then promote the videos through
 YouTube and Google Ads. The goal is to attract attention that Hastings County as a great
 place to operate a business, and show that newcomers are already doing it.
- The area covered by Hastings County include entrepreneurs in Deseronto, Tyendinaga Township, Tweed, Centre Hastings, Stirling-Rawdon, Marmora & Lake and north to Bancroft.
- October 09, 2014
- Quinte Immigration Services QUIS Open House event included the QLIP office
- The public, services providers and municipal representatives attended the open house for all services housed at 41 Octavia Street in Belleville including the QLIP office.

- October 23, 2014
- Magnet Workshop new employment engine that will prove helpful to newcomers as it is skills and education based.
- Quinte West Chamber of Commerce sponsored a free "Magnet" workshop on October 23rd as part of the Small Business Week workshop series. The presenter was Louie DiPalma of the Ontario Chamber of Commerce, one of the main supports of this initiative, and a Magnet representative, to discuss how the system works and the technical aspects. It was held from 2:00 until 4:00 at the Bay of Quinte Golf Club in Quinte West.
- QLIP Project Coordinator discussed with the representative for Magnet the implications for newcomers that may become involved in Magnet employment system. Questions surrounding the application of the system for newcomers to the Quinte Region were answered in terms of an employer seeking certain skill and education as applicants can build a profile online in a multimedia setting if desired.
- The Magnet system is based on the need to deal with unemployment and underemployment which affects some newcomers who register at Quinte Immigration Services.
- October 24, 2014
- Quinte Business Achievement Awards Gala 2014 Friday, October 24, 2014
- QLIP Project Coordinator attended the 17th Annual Quinte Business Achievement Awards
 Gala, on the evening of October 24, 2014 at the National Air Force Museum of Canada in
 Quinte West. The Quinte Business Achievement Awards Program includes Belleville, Brighton,
 Quinte West, and Prince Edward County.
- The QLIP Coordinator was a nominee for Not-for-Profit entrepreneur of the year 2014 for the Quinte Local Immigration Partnership. The award went to another nominee but being nominated was an honour. The event was attended by 350 guests from the business and not-for-profit community. As the master of ceremonies announced each nominee, he announced their "enterprise or company name" and the QLIP logo was displayed on a big screen providing more public and business community exposure for the QLIP Partnership.

- the QLIP Partnership Facilitator participated in the "Bay of Quinte Living Council" meetings in October and along with QLIP partners maintained the focus on attraction and retention of newcomers to the Quinte Region

- The Collaborative protocol between Quinte Immigration Services QUIS and Community Employment Services CES continues through 2014. A CES Employment Consultant meets with newcomers at QUIS for employment counselling. Since the implementation forty-two (42) newcomers have received "one-on-one" employment counselling which is positively shifting patterns in newcomers' approach to Employment Services that may ultimately affect labour market outcomes for newcomers to the Quinte Region.

- GTOC provides all disadvantaged women, of every race and age, a next level home and the
 tools for higher education and support to re-enter the workforce as viable, self-sustaining
 contributors to their communities.
- In October 2014 Veronica Hendrick-Lockyer President Glass Tower Offices Corporation proposed a concert event focused on newcomers. The proposal would be supported by local businesses would involve bringing to Belleville, Juno Award winning Canadian Music Star, JRDN, also known as Jordan Croucher for a concert while on his "Me to We" tour, the event would be aimed at appreciating newcomers to the Quinte Region. Tickets would be free to newcomers and would involve a pre-concert gathering separate from the concert area for supporters and newcomers to mingle, to ensure networking opportunities. This event would highlight the Quinte Region community's appreciation of newcomers living in the Quinte Region and also show potential newcomers this same friendly atmosphere as a potential region to immigrate to.

- Strengthen labour market outcomes for newcomers to the Greater Quinte Region through the Skills Matching Program called "Magnet", which has now been established in the Quinte Region as a vehicle that will assist newcomers in terms of potential for jobs related to their education and skills. QLIP Coordinator and other QLIP Partners participated in the workshop on the Magnet system. Many community organizations have joined the Magnet program on the contributor side that will allow resumes and skills to be loaded into the system for employer to search for candidates.
- Continue communication on the "Elevate Training Program" and how newcomers are able to participate in this training program related to jobs in the food processing industry.
- Continued activity QLIP Partnership will continue to explore the possibility of interviews and focus groups with newcomers.
