Introductions and opening remarks

- Acknowledgement Special appreciation to Karen Post Manager of Economic and Strategic Initiatives and staff City of Belleville, and the City of Belleville for their provision of the Sir Mackenzie Bowell Meeting Room at Belleville City Hall.
- Rob Clute Executive Director QuinteVation presented the QuinteVation video and presentation "Start It. Bring It. Make It. Grow Your Business." Available on the website at: http://www.quintevation.ca and provided a complete overview of their approach methods and outcomes. The Purpose of QuinteVation is to facilitate and encourage business innovation by entrepreneurs and thereby accelerate the growth of industries/sectors in the Bay of Quinte Region. Their Vision is to make the Bay of Quinte the most dynamic rural innovation destination in Canada by 2023. More information is available at the website.
- Cathy Ireland Project Coordinator RevUp QuinteVation's RevUp Pilot is a 6 month program, designed to help Innovative companies with scaling and rapid growth challenges. Through this structured program, participants benefit from working with a team of Entrepreneurs in Residence (EIR's). http://www.quintevation.ca/rev-up-quinte
- Jacques Pilon Entrepreneur in Residence EIR Launch Lab Helping entrepreneurs succeed they are a team of entrepreneurs helping entrepreneurs providing advisory services by pairing entrepreneurs with their team of experienced business owners from Kingston and most of southeastern Ontario for one-on-one mentorship and guidance, the Quinte area included. https://www.launchlab.ca
- All three presentations were well received and included Q&A sessions throughout. There are many connections related to area newcomer projects and programs encouraging entrepreneurial newcomers to come to the Quinte Region including the QUIS Pilot Project "Economic Development Through Immigration EDTI" and the QUIS / QLIP interactions with the Rural Employment Initiative REI in Peel Region to refer skilled newcomers who are "job ready" to the Quinte Region from the Greater Toronto Area GTA who are interested in relocation to rural Ontario. These efforts are reinforced by the information on the skills shortages in the Quinte Region. QLIP Partners support these efforts to bring skilled qualified newcomers to the region.
- The publication "Bridging Two Worlds: Supporting Newcomer and Refugee Youth" was contributed by Mike Hewitt to the QLIP Partnership. Information at: http://ceric.ca/publications "Bridging Two Worlds provides teachers, school administrators and counsellors with the knowledge and practical resources to deliver more informed and culturally responsive career development and guidance to newcomer and refugee youth from Kindergarten to Grade 12. This book and the study upon which it is based grew out of the Canadian spirit of cultural diversity and inclusivity. Bridging Two Worlds offers data-informed curriculum development and instructional ideas that recognize and address educational gaps as well as cultural or experiential differences that impede progress." - International Students boom at Loyalist College Loyalist is a very popular school for international students with over 500 currently enrolled and upon graduation may apply for post-graduation work permits that will allow the graduating student to work in their field in Canada from nine (9) months to three (3) years depending on the length their school program and could eventually lead to staying in Canada. Settlement Workers have been diligently assisting well over 100 Loyalist College international graduates applying for post-graduation work permits in May and June while carrying their regular client workload. The numbers are growing each year and it has become apparent that QUIS through its Settlement Workers and Loyalist College representatives need to arrive at a method or protocol to assist the large numbers of international students collectively to process their applications for post-graduate work permits possibly at the college in a computer equipped room, in the spring.

- Employing skilled newcomer graduates to fill workforce gaps within the Quinte Region including those related to the growth of entrepreneurs through programs like QuinteVation and its RevUp project and Launch Lab and the establishment of newcomer entrepreneur businesses flowing from projects like the Economic Development through Immigration EDTI Pilot Project at Quinte Immigration Services QUIS and other attraction methods.
- Economic Development through Immigration EDTI Pilot Project designed to assist immigrant businesses including entrepreneurs wishing to move or relocate to the Quinte Region within Canada and internationally, and also to match newcomers with job opportunities in relation to labour shortages. The Pilot Project is housed at Quinte Immigration Services QUIS with information available on the QUIS website and marketed through the "Bay of Quinte Immigration website".

- **Real solutions:** The REI connects skilled immigrants in Peel Region and the Greater Toronto Area with employers in rural Ontario that have sustainable job opportunities, and facilitates their movement from the metropolitan GTA to rural Ontario.
- REI has over 300 skilled immigrant clients who are seeking employment outside of the GTA, interested in relocating to rural Ontario. Many of these candidates have skills in areas such as healthcare services, Human Resources, skilled trades and business management. http://www.ncpeel.ca/services/look-for-employment
- Employers and Employment Consultants in the Quinte Region may find the REI initiative a positive force in recruiting established skilled workers to fill skill shortages. The REI goal is to connect job ready highly qualified immigrants having a Canadian language benchmark of CLB 6 or higher, who are ready to relocate to rural Ontario for viable job opportunities.
